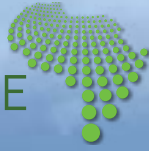

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Introduction



Kenya is one of the world's greatest tourism destinations, known for its remarkable diversity of landscapes, wildlife and cultures. From sweeping savannahs to tropical beaches and coral reef. From dense mountain forests to mighty snow-capped mountains and more, Kenya is a world unto itself. Key attractions include witnessing the magnitude of the Wildebeest migration, the diversity visible in the variety of national parks and the tropical coastline famous for white sand beaches lined with palms. Nairobi is East Africa's main hub and the starting point for travel and safaris in this region. Situated at 5,500ft, the city was originally founded as a railway station in 1899. It marks the crossroads between the Northern Highlands, the low-lying Rift Valley and the Eastern Savannah. There is an abundance of safari and wildlife destinations in Kenya to choose from, including the Maasai Mara, the Rift Valley, Mount Kenya, Amboseli National Park, Tsavo East & West Parks and Samburu National Reserve. Kenya currency is the shilling which is divisible into 100 cents. The Kenyan south coast is a popular destination for a beach break and the Mombasa Marine National Park, Shanzu beach and Diani beach are firm favourites of this region. The north coast also has an allure with highlights such as Malindi and Watamu beaches and the Lamu archipelago.



Easy Access

Nairobi is the most effective gateway for all international arrivals in the region. There are daily scheduled flights into Nairobi's Jomo Kenyatta International Airport (JKIA). There are also less frequent international flights into Mombasa. There are daily domestic flights operating from JKIA, Wilson Airport (also in Nairobi) and from other smaller Kenyan towns and cities, such as Mombasa.

A number of charter companies operate flight services to the various airstrips located in the national parks and on private game reserves. There are also direct charter flight services between Nairobi and the Kenyan coastal cities of Mombasa and Diani Beach.

Kenya Climate

Given the variety of landscapes found in Kenya, from mountainous highlands to savannah woodland, tropical rain forests to desert scrubland, the climate can vary depending on the region. At the coast, the weather is hot and often humid, in the north and north-east region, the days are dry and hot, and mornings in the central highlands can be cool. There are two rainy seasons which affect most of the country. The short rains usually occur from late October through to December. The long rains occur between March and June. Rainfall is seldom continuous over long periods and dry, sunny periods do occur during the rainy seasons.



The best time to view the Wildebeest migration in the Maasai Mara is from mid July to early October. The best weather at the coast is from August through to April. The driest month is January and June, July and August are the coolest months.

Fairmont Mara Safari Club is the epitome of tented luxury. The lodge is located at the foot of the Aitong Hills in the Ol-Choro Oiroua Conservation Area, which borders the Masai Mara Game Reserve. Access is easiest via a one hour charter flight from Nairobi Wilson Airport to the Ngerende airstrip, which is located only 10 minutes from the Club. With four poster, pillow-top beds and a veranda overlooking the hippo and crocodile-filled river, each of the 38 tents at Fairmont Mara Safari Club is superbly furnished with its own private, three piece bathroom, including a number of "outdoor showers" in select tents.

The main lodge at the center of the camp hosts an indoor restaurant, bar and library with internet access. A spacious outside deck overhangs the river and leads to a heated pool complete with private massage tents. The Pool Bar is a shaded area with bar stools set around the curved structure. Outdoor dining has been enhanced with the creation of a boma, a structure influenced by traditional homesteads, where guests can enjoy a cultural dinner which includes delicious African cuisine and rich musical accompaniment. On the western boundary of the Masai Mara National Reserve, you will find Kichwa Tembo, one of Kenya's best loved safari camps. Part of a private concession leased from the Masai, the camp is well situated for witnessing the annual Great Migration of wildebeest as well as viewing the diverse and abundant resident wildlife. The Masai Mara National Reserve is part of a vast conservation area incorporating the Serengeti National Park and Ngorongoro Conservation Area in neighbouring Tanzania. There are two scheduled flights a day to the private airstrip from Wilson Airport, followed by a 30 minute drive to the lodge.

Activities on offer include twice daily game drives; night drives; bush walks; Hot air ballooning; interaction with the Maasai; Maasai dancers and Maasai talks. The rim-flow swimming pool, literally on the edge of the Mara, boasts one of the world's most extraordinary views.

Angama Mara, a remarkable owner-run safari lodge is inspired by the Swahili word for 'suspended in mid-air'. Located high above the floor of Africa's Great Rift Valley, Angama Mara overlooks Kenya's Maasai Mara, considered by many as the loveliest game reserve on the continent.

The lodge comprises two totally separate camps of just 15 tents each, every one with magnificent 180° views. The two camps are set alongside one another, each with its own guest area, kitchen and dedicated staff. Each camp has two sets of interconnecting tents, perfect for families. The dramatic guest areas are for dining, drinking and lounging, and include a handsome brick-clad library. An infinity swimming pool of 12m x 6m, heated by solar power and enclosed on three sides for privacy, with both shaded and unshaded sun loungers.

Access is via a 1-hour charter flight from Wilson Airport direct to the Angama Mara Airstrip – just a 5-minute drive away.

*Angama Mara is set on the very site where some of the most romantic scenes in *Out of Africa* were filmed, including the picnic scene featured on the movie's poster. Angama Mara's chefs prepare classic safari food, focusing on it being perfectly cooked and freshly made, yet beautifully and simply presented. Days are as action-packed or as gentle as guests choose them to be. The Mara Triangle is home to Africa's great mammals, a mere 10 minute drive from the lodge, and guests can experience hot air ballooning, walking safaris, cultural visits to neighbouring Maasai villages – or simply do nothing at all.*

Bathrooms are appointed with his and hers sinks and a bath in addition to a shower.

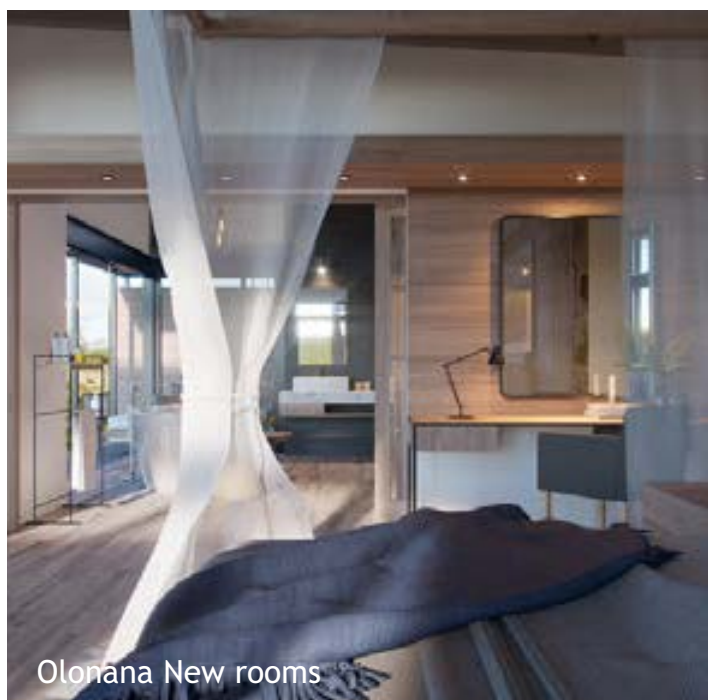

Located in an acacia grove by a gentle mountain spring, the hotel, comprising a Masai-inspired design, a garden restaurant and a palm-shaded swimming pool and sun deck, provides uninterrupted views of Mount Kilimanjaro and the surrounding landscape. In every detail, the ambiance captures the essence of Masai culture, warmth and indomitable spirit. Activities range from Big Five safari to planting your very own tree as part of their reforestation program.

Big Five Safari

Birthplace of the classic Hemingway-style safari, Kenya is home to some of the best game viewing and most famous reserves on the continent. But unlike neighbouring Tanzania, Kenya's safari destinations are scattered throughout the country. The most famous region has to be the Maasai Mara, renowned for watching the great Wildebeest Migration every year.

Amboseli National Park is eastern Kenya's top reserve. Amboseli sits right on the border with Tanzania and is famous for its scenes of elephants moving across the plains as a snow-capped Mount Kilimanjaro appears behind them.

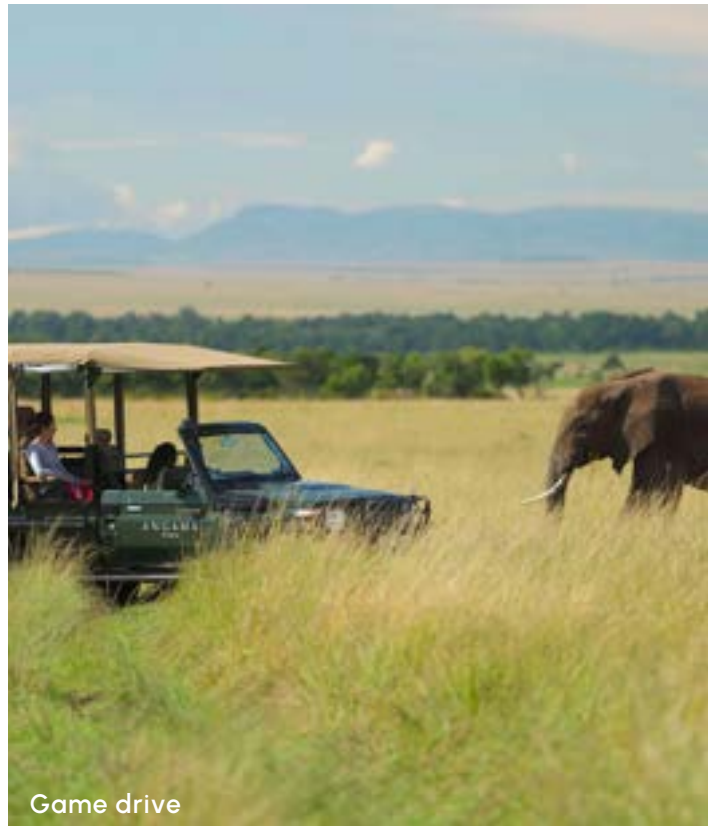
In the reserves of the north the Samburu and Shaba National Reserves flank the Ewaso Ngiro River.

Tsavo East National Park is the largest park in Kenya and one of the biggest in Africa – a vast area of dry bush, inhabited by huge herds of brick-red elephants. The Galana River creates a beautiful landscape as it cuts through the park.

Tsavo West National Park is an extensive region of spectacular, volcanic and hilly landscapes, encompassing rolling grassland, woodland, and stream and river valleys. A wildlife-rich area, its most magnetic attraction is Mzima Springs.

Walking Safaris are probably one of the most exciting and in-demand activities in the African bush, and, together with conventional game viewing by vehicle, provide indelible memories of the scents and sounds of wild Africa.



Unique Activities

Hot Air Ballooning

Floating effortlessly over the Maasai Mara in a hot air balloon is one of Africa's iconic experiences: as the sunrise unfolds slowly to the East, the legendary Mara River winds and twists beneath you, and the great plains of East Africa open up in front of you, keep your wits about you and your binoculars in hand to spot the wildlife lurking in the grass, or a pride of lions on an early morning hunt. With an early, pre-dawn start, this is an experience not to be forgotten, and completed in style with a celebratory champagne breakfast under an acacia tree in the middle of the reserve.

The Great Migration

Great Migration is an annual journey which sees millions of wildebeest and zebra travel between Tanzania's Serengeti National Park and Kenya's Maasai Mara, following the seasonal rains in search of greener pastures. The crossings of the Mara River are famous as the dramatic pinnacle, where hungry crocodiles and ambushing lions lie in wait, but equally as enchanting is to drive amongst the mega-herds, surrounded by wildebeest as far as the eye can see

Dining Out

Kenya's multicultural heritage, with strong Arabic, Portuguese, Chinese, Indian and English influences, is reflected in the wide range of foods and specialities available. Over time, the travellers who have touched Kenyan shores have left behind a legacy of spices and exotic recipe combinations that survive to this day.

Nairobi and Mombasa play host to a number of popular eateries. In particular, the Carnivore in Nairobi is famed for its large barbeque pit from which exotic meats such as zebra and warthog are served. Delicious vegetarian meals with an Indian influence are also widely available in the cities and beach resorts.

The Lodges and beach resorts provide delicious and elaborate buffets comprising an assortment of high quality beef and seafood dishes.

These are supplemented by an array of fresh vegetables (such as okra, beans, cassava and potatoes) prepared in many interesting ways and delicious tropical fruits (such as papaya, banana and pineapple) which are served fresh or as part of more elaborate recipes. Western-styled meals to suit the most demanding palates are also readily available.

Typical Swahili cuisine along the Kenyan coast includes a variety of meals prepared using fish, tropical fruits, coconut milk and exotic spices. Tiny cups of coffee served with haluwa, a traditional sweet meat, exemplify the Arab influence and are particularly popular at the coast.
