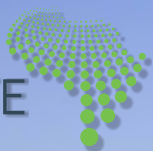

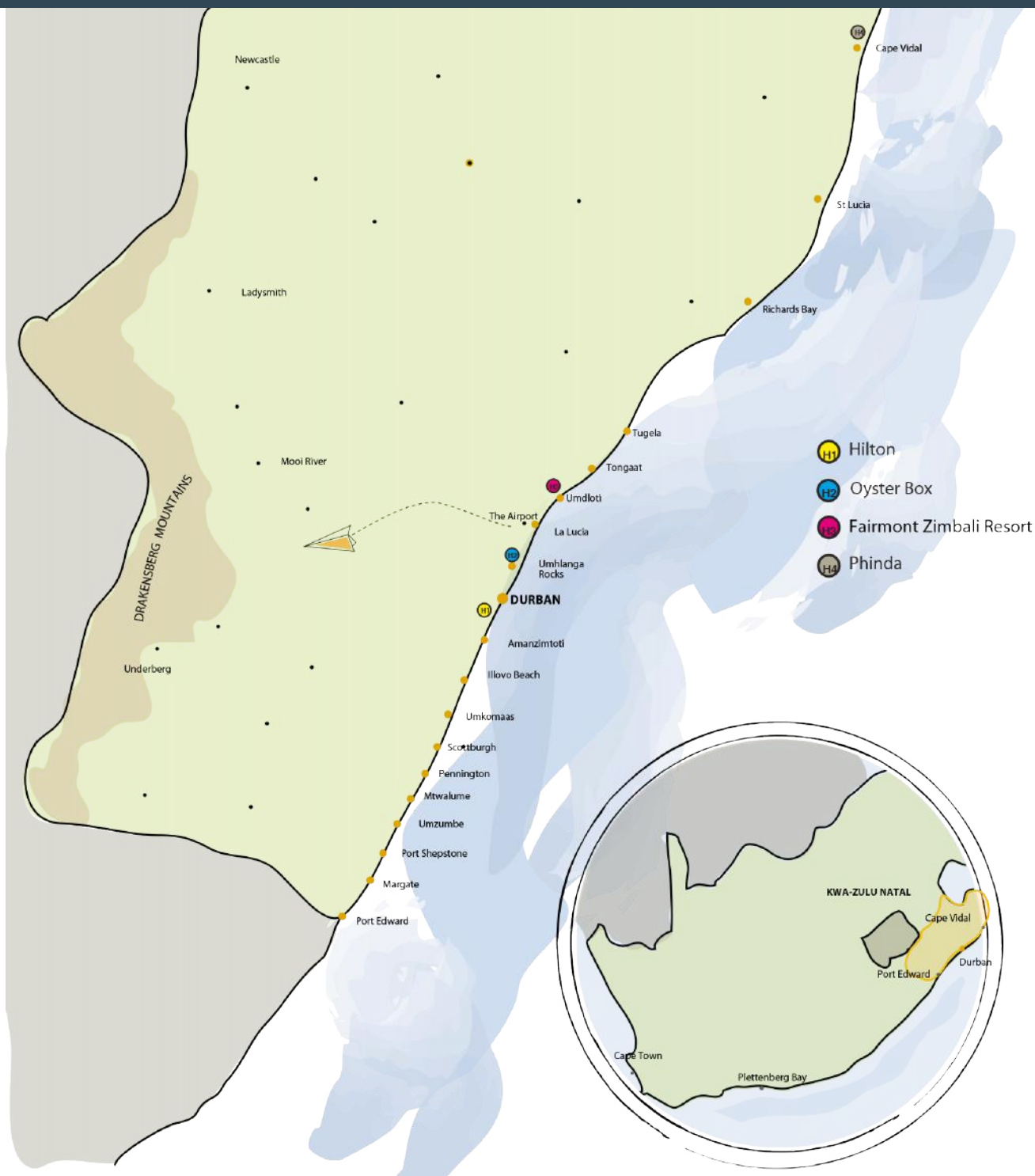

Introduction



Welcome to the Zulu Kingdom or the South African province of KwaZulu-Natal - a spectacular and fascinating multi-cultural destination flanked by the warm Indian Ocean and soaring peaks of the Drakensberg. The coastal region iSimangaliso (Greater St Lucia) Wetland Park, is a World Heritage Site located due east of significant landmarks in Zulu history.

Here the mountainous ("Barrier of Spears") uKhahlamba-Drakensberg Park World Heritage Site is adorned with Stone Age cave paintings. This is the realm of the legendary Zulu kings, steeped in tradition and timeless Indian culture. You can view colonial reminders shoulder-to-shoulder with icons of democracy. The coastal city of Durban is a pulsating and inviting fusion of East, West, and Zulu motifs overlooking Africa's busiest picture-postcard seaport. Visit any one of the expansive golden beaches interspersed with modern resorts.

KwaZulu-Natal is a magnet for thrill-seekers in the great outdoors - from wave riders and hang-gliders to golfers and mountain bikers. The South Coast is host to one of nature's annual extravaganzas - the unforgettable cast-of-millions Sardine run, while the North Coast boasts year-round frolicking dolphins plus majestic seasonal whale migrations. The Elephant Coast has Big Five nature reserves amid Zulu customs in Zululand.

The midlands is a collection of history-filled towns leading to adventure sports and game viewing, along with outlets for unique arts and crafts. The Battlefields represent the battles of yesteryear where Zulu, Boer and British now make pilgrimages of reconciliation. There is also a vibrant music and theatre scene to enjoy, so whatever your visit, this destination will entertain and charm any traveller..

Easy Access



Most visitors arrive at the Durban King Shaka International Airport, conveniently located on the North Coast and just 25 minutes from Durban city center. Furthermore, the airport is now a gateway to the luxury resorts and northern safari region.

Emirates and Air Mauritius are the main international airlines flying into Durban and there are a host of domestic carriers, such as SAA, BA, Mango and Kulula, connecting the province to the rest of the country.

There are direct flights from Johannesburg to Richards Bay Airport, in the north of the province, ideal access to the Big Five Game Reserves, and Pietermaritzburg Airport, a gateway to the Drakensberg and Battlefield regions.

A few of the Private Game Reserves have airstrips for charter flights. Rovos Rail luxury train offers a regular, two night journey between Pretoria and Durban.

Climate

KwaZulu-Natal, on the eastern side of South Africa, borders the warm Indian Ocean to the east and the high escarpment of the Drakensberg Mountains to the west. The province has a warm, sub-tropical climate, with temperatures moderated by the expanse of the Indian Ocean.

Summers are hot and humid averaging 82°F (28°C) degrees, while winters average temperatures of 73°F (23°C) degrees, are warm, dry and clear. There is occasional frost in the interior and snow often falls in the higher reaches in winter. Winter sunshine averages almost 7 hours a day, some of the highest in the country.

Thanda, meaning 'love' in Zulu, is an expression of the magical union of the power of Zulu culture, wildlife, romance and exclusivity. Thanda Private Game Reserve is South Africa's top award-winning safari destination and is situated in northern Zululand, in close proximity to the Indian Ocean. Access by road is from Durban - duration is four hours. Alternatively fly into Richards Bay followed by a 16 hour road transfer. The main lodge encompasses nine bush villas.

Circular in structure and reminiscent of a traditional homestead, each of the villas boasts a breathtaking view of the surrounding game reserve. 264 yd² (220m²) in size, each villa has its own spacious lounge area and master bedroom with an interleading fireplace. A thatched outdoor game viewing deck (sala) and infinity pool offer refreshing solace from the summer heat.

At the Safari Camp the fifteen new, luxury tents each have a viewing deck and an en-suite canvas bathroom. Public facilities at the tented camp include an attractive reception area, a curio shop, a new lounge area for guests to relax in, an enhanced dining tent, a 33x16ft (10x5m) rim-flow pool and a new boma (outdoor dining area). The camp is located 15 minutes from the main lodge.

Thanda's Villa iZulu is fit for royalty and is surrounded by expanses of African bush. The private villa can accommodate ten guests in five luxuriously appointed suites.

Located in KwaZulu-Natal and showcasing one of the continents finest Big 5 game viewing experiences, Phinda is described as "Seven Worlds of Wonder" due to its seven distinct habitats. A magnificent tapestry of woodland, grassland, wetland and forest, interspersed with mountains, rivers, marshes and pans, Phinda has a rich diversity of ecosystems and wildlife.

Home to 2470 acres (1000 hectares) of Africa's remaining rare dry sand forest, the Reserve lies in close proximity to the unspoiled beaches and spectacular reefs of the Indian Ocean, offering a unique combination of beach and bush adventure and an opportunity to see the Leatherback Turtles laying eggs on the beach at specific times of the year.

Access by road is from Durban - duration is 4 hours. Alternatively, fly into Richards Bay followed by a 1½ hour road transfer. A third option is to charter directly to the lodge airstrip from any of the major cities.

Situated in the northern KwaZulu-Natal area, Phinda borders conservation areas such as the Greater St Lucia Wetlands Park - a World Heritage Site. This unique Reserve has earned prestigious awards and recognition as being one of the world's premier benchmarks for responsible, sustainable ecotourism.

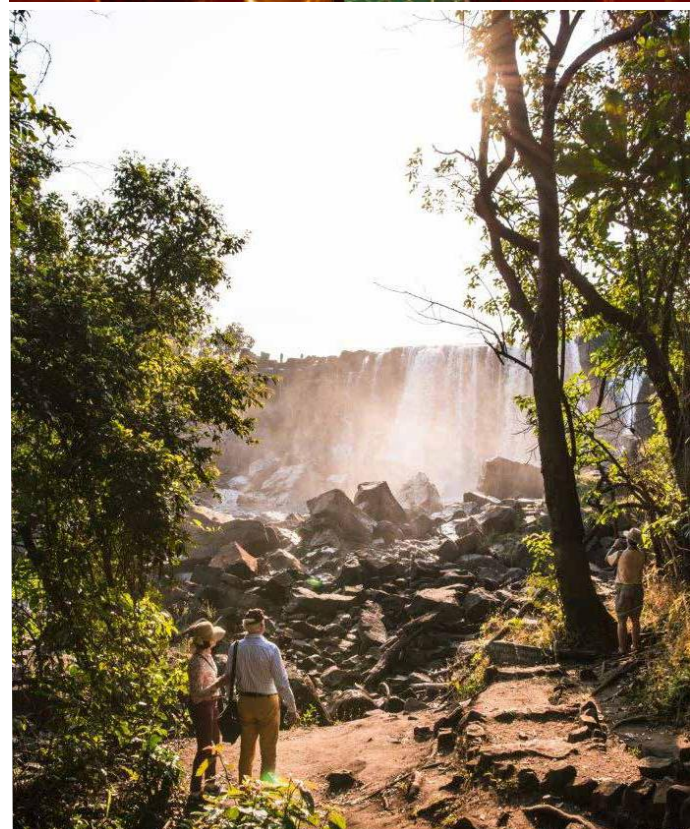

Whilst not officially a hotel, the Rovos Rail works incredibly well when combined with a beach resort, or safari in KwaZulu-Natal. The luxury train runs between Pretoria and Durban, in both directions. This three-day journey allows guests to experience the splendour of KwaZulu-Natal; take in the Big Five, visit a battlefields tour with a world-class historian and stop at an unusual African ceramics centre.

Experience the Nambiti Conservancy – a Big Five private bush retreat set on 20 000 acres (8 090 hectares) of malaria free bushveld in KwaZulu-Natal. It has an incredible biodiversity including savannah, grasslands, thornveld and tall acacia trees.

The Sundays River flows through the reserve and has two 130ft (40m) waterfalls with magnificent ravine bush, home to several rare bird species. Situated on an expansive game farm, Spionkop Lodge – which adjoins an 11 000 acre (4 450 hectare) nature reserve – is the perfect base for exploring the mountains, bush, birds and battlefields of the region.

Ardmore Ceramics is a story about the Zulu people whose sense of rhythm, colour, dance and song, as well as the spirit of the African imagination, is exerting its influence on the other continents of the world. Paya morning visit to this charming centre in the rolling hills of the Midlands before the train makes its way to Durban.

USHAKA MARINE WORLD



Highlights

iSimangaliso (St Lucia) Wetlands

The iSimangaliso Wetland Park was listed as South Africa's first World Heritage Site in December 1999 in recognition of its superlative natural beauty and unique global values.

The 1 266mi² (3 280km²) Park contains three major lake systems, eight interlinking ecosystems, 700 year old fishing traditions, most of South Africa's remaining swamp forests, Africa's largest estuarine system, 526 bird species and 25 000 year-old coastal dunes – among the highest in the world.

A visit to St Lucia is possible as a day excursion from Durban. After a scenic drive through Zululand to St Lucia you head for the estuary mouth as the first stop. A short hike through the game reserve gives you an opportunity to encounter various wildlife and birdlife. After lunch, relax on a boat ride to view crocodiles, hippos and the African fish eagle amongst many species of birds.

You'll learn about the delicate balance of 5 ecosystems in the area, and many facts about the large and small inhabitants of these regions, before your late afternoon drive back to Durban.

Highlights

iDrakensberg / Sani Pass

The beauty of the undulating Drakensberg Mountains is indisputable, but in addition to travelling through such breathtaking vistas, visit the World Heritage Site of Giant's Castle and the enigmatic Bushman paintings in the vicinity. Upon arrival, it is a leisurely 3km round hike to the site of the caves, to discover this magical legacy of the Bushmen (moderate fitness level required). The paintings date back 2000 years. After the hike enjoy a hearty lunch. Return to Durban via the charming Midlands Meander Route, a community of country crafters and farmers who produce quality wares and live enviable country lives. Another beautiful area of the Drakensberg to visit is the Sani Pass. The Sani Pass is the only vehicle route over the Drakensberg escarpment and into the mountain Kingdom of Lesotho. It is a spectacular 4x4 track snaking its way through the rocky cliffs to the top of the world. Before the 1950's, it was a trail for pack animals to carry goods through to the isolated town of Mokhotlong in Eastern Lesotho.

The Battlefields

Historians and lovers of a really great story will enjoy a visit to the Battlefields. KwaZulu-Natal is rich in Anglo-Zulu war history, where two of the most famous, at times heart-wrenching battles, fought between the Zulu and British Armies took place. Visit the eerie battlefields of Isandlwana and Rorke's Drift, and let your imagination paint mental pictures of the battle scenes played out here. This is approximately a two hour drive from Durban.

Shakaland

Shakaland is located approximately a 1,5 hour's drive from Durban. Shaka was the legendary King of the Zulus. Experience traditional Zulu culture and customs at the largest Zulu kraal in Zululand and look into the future with a Sangoma or traditional healer. Sample traditional Zulu beer while the craftsmen and community who make the spears, shields, beadwork, pots and their huts, open their doors to share their skills and artistry. The Zulu dancers thrill with their grace and energy, and afterwards enjoy a lunchtime feast featuring local and international cuisine. Live a day in the life of a traditional community. For groups, there is a modern conference room available for up to 100 delegates, and a variety of teambuilding opportunities.

uShaka Marine World

On Durban's beachfront is Ushaka Marine World. Home to Africa's largest dolphinarium, the globally respected uShaka Marine World entices you to explore the wonders of Africa's vast ocean life.

It's a fascinating journey around 30 indoor and outdoor themed exhibits, and you won't want to miss the spectacular dolphin, seal, and penguin shows. In the aquarium, tank after tank offers a glorious insight into the wealth of South Africa's Indian and Atlantic Ocean marine life.

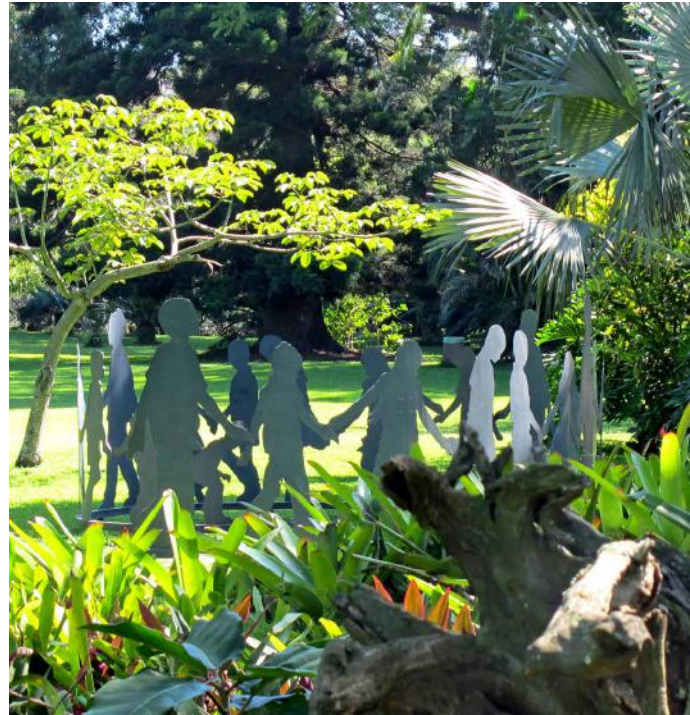
Durban

Spend half a day discovering the cultural and historical contrasts of this city. A morning drive follows the newly restored Golden Mile, a wonderful promenade that stretches along the beachfront, before moving on to the fascinating KwaMuhle Museum (closed Sundays) where you can uncover the past.

Go green thereafter, and head for the lush, peace and tranquility of Durban's beautiful Botanical Gardens. Founded in 1849, the immaculate gardens house a fine mix of African, Asian and American trees, not to mention a superb orchid house. To accompany the exploration of Indian culture and history, try a taste of Indian cuisine, with the unique Bunny Chow!

Then proceed to an icon of KwaZulu-Natal, the Moses Mabhida Stadium where you will have the option of experiencing the cable car ride to the top of the Stadium for a phenomenal view of Durban and its surroundings.

For shopaholics, a visit to Victoria Street will awaken the senses with the sights, smells, and sounds of a working market. On the other end of the shopping spectrum, is Gateway, a huge shopping and entertainment complex.

Hluhluwe iMfolozi Game Reserve

Hluhluwe iMfolozi Game Reserve, located 174mi (280km) north of Durban (a 3 hour drive), is the oldest proclaimed park in Africa. It consists of 370mi² (960km²) of hilly topography in central Zululand, and is known for its rich wildlife and conservation efforts.

Hluhluwe is the only state-run park in KwaZulu-Natal where all the Big-Five game occurs. Due to conservation efforts, the park now has the largest population of white rhino in the world. Apart from the Big-Five, elephant, rhinoceros (black hook-lipped and white square-lipped), Cape buffalo, lion, and leopard, it is home to 86 special species including: Nile crocodile, hippo, cheetah, hyena, blue wildebeest, jackal, giraffe, zebra, waterbuck, nyala, eland, kudu, impala, duiker, suni, reedbuck, warthog, bushpig, mongoose, baboons, monkeys, and a variety of tortoises, terrapins, snakes and lizards.

It is one of the world's top spots for viewing nyala. The park is a prime birding destination and is home to 340 bird species. Game drives through the park are done in 4x4 vehicles. Groups can enjoy lunch at Hilltop Camp or an al fresco BBQ in the reserve at designated locations.

Activities

Surf Lessons

Durban, the birthplace of surfing in South Africa, offers numerous, incredible surf breaks in wonderful, tropical, and warm water conditions.

At a highly professional surf school near uShaka Marine World in Durban, get together with your colleagues and tick off one on the bucket list! Set-up includes gazebos on the beach, with loungers and beach chairs, where you can either choose to relax or take part in surfing lessons, beach volleyball, body-boarding, and kayaking. Suitable for all levels of expertise - from beginners to pros.

Shark Cage Diving at Rocky Bay

Previously the domain of the Western Cape, Shark Cage Diving is now available off the KwaZulu-Natal coastline.

Situated only 60 minutes from King Shaka International Airport, on the KwaZulu-Natal South Coast, the boats launch from the safest site on the Natal South Coast - Rocky Bay. In the warmer waters of KwaZulu-Natal, different species of shark can be found like Blacktip sharks, Dusky Sharks, Spinner Sharks, Tiger and Zambezi Sharks as these species are smaller than the Great White Shark and their main diet consists of small schooling fish.

A typical shark cage dive involves getting into a wetsuit or a costume, donning a mask and climbing into a floating stainless steel cage with between five and twenty sharks gliding gracefully by the cage walls.



Activities

Canoe & Wine Tasting

The Zinkwazi River Estuary is a mere 50mi (80km) from Durban, on the North Coast. Incorporate a canoe trip on the extremely safe, 4mi (7km) lagoon, followed by a wine tasting on the banks of the river.

Start with a safety briefing by professional facilitators then gently paddle along the pristine river banks, home to numerous bird species. On return, a wine tasting will be setup on the banks of the river.

Duration of the activity is approximately four hours.

Discover Durban Adventure Rally

This unique, tailor-made "Discover Durban Rally" starts at the beautifully designed Moses Mabhida Stadium, home to the World Cup Soccer in 2010. The activity starts with an introductory lesson on how to manoeuvre these two wheeled vehicles - the segway.

From there, the group is split into two, half doing a Segway Tour of the Stadium and the other half going up the SkyCar for a magnificent view over Durban and the Indian Ocean. Then they swap around.

Delegates then each climb onto a bicycle, for a cycle from the stadium along the Promenade, past Sun Coast and to Circus Circus Restaurant. This is an easy 15 minute cycle and ideal way to explore the unique beachfront.

After a short break, continue onto uShaka Marine World. Along the way barter with the locals for a traditional Rickshaw ride. On arrival at uShaka there is time at leisure to explore the Aquarium.



Dining

Due to the complete diversity of cultures in KwaZulu-Natal, many different cuisines are available, from Asian to International. Durban, however, is most famous for its curries, due to the long tradition of Indian culture. Numerous award-winning restaurants serve traditional Indian cuisine.

Even more famous is the Bunny Chow, a half loaf of white bread filled with delicious, hot curry. Also, being a coastal city with the warm Indian Ocean as its shoreline, numerous sunset cruises are available, offering delicious seafood delicacies.

On safari enjoy traditional African BBQ. Many venues play on the colonial past and offer a 'slice of Britain in Africa', with traditional British cuisine and décor.
